Pre-Exposure Prophylaxis (PrEP) for HIV: The Basics and Beyond

In this interactive webinar, Dr. Kevin Ard will review how to prescribe and monitor PrEP. Using patient cases, he will discuss unique considerations that apply to PrEP management for transgender people, serodifferent couples, those who are pregnant or trying to conceive, and adolescents.

Through real-world examples, participants will learn how to incorporate PrEP into diverse clinic settings. Finally, Dr. Ard will describe the new PrEP Action Kit that the Education Center published and discuss how providers can adapt the kit for use in one's own health center. This webinar will be useful for both clinicians who are new




to PrEP and those who are experienced PrEP providers, as well as administrators interested in creating a PrEP program.

This PrEP Action Kit includes clinical resources to help providers incorporate PrEP into their practices. Including helpful resources such as tips on taking a comprehensive sexual history, frequently asked questions about PrEP and a pocket card about PrEP prescribing and monitoring, this action kit is an essential resource for all providers treating LGBT patients or patients at risk of HIV infection.

Each year, approximately 40,000 people are diagnosed with HIV infection in the United States, and many others are at risk. There is a new opportunity to prevent HIV by offering pre-exposure prophylaxis (PrEP) to people with a high risk of infection. PrEP is a biomedical intervention consisting of a daily, oral medication to prevent HIV acquisition; it is more than 90% effective if take regularly.

This PrEP Action Kit includes:

- 1. Tips on taking a comprehensive sexual history**
- 2. Frequently asked questions about PrEP**
- 3. A pocket card for PrEP prescribing and monitoring**
- 4. Information on PrEP use in special populations, such as pregnant people and adolescents**
